The original band of forty Airborne troopers escaped from Vietnam as a group, in 1975, and they lived communally for their first few years in Oklahoma City. Although, when they arrived, the majority had only elementary educations, and few could speak English, by applying their Airborne disciplines, remaining together as a group and by helping one another, they proved the American dream is still alive.
